Ala Wai boat harbor to get \$4.2 million renovation

The state has released \$4.2 million for improvement projects at Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor, including dock replacements and infrastructure upgrades.

A majority of the money — about \$3.5 million — will be used to replace docks B, C and D. More than 35 years old, the docks have exceeded their life span and 80 of the 172 slips are currently out of service due to safety concerns.

About \$100,000 will go toward the replacement of the harbor's transient docks at the small boat harbor. About \$390,000 will be spent on redesigning Row 700 docks and Row 500 docks.

Finally, \$200,000 will be spent to design upgrades to the harbor's water, sewer and electrical infrastructure.

These projects come after the recent \$1.65 million replacement of dock F.

Ala Wai harbor reconstruction begins

Work began Monday on new floating docks at the **Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor** in Honolulu.

The Ala Wai harbor is considered the state's flagship recreational boating facility.

The \$2.87 million project involves demolishing three existing cross and floating docks, and installing aluminum-framed floating dock systems to replace existing concrete fixed and floating docks.

The concrete docks, which were installed in 1972, have deteriorated badly due to decades of neglect.

The new docks will contain dock boxes, modular electrical power pedestals, potable water, fire protection, and optional telephone and cable boxes.

The installation of the docks, by **Hawaiian Dredging Construction Co.**, is scheduled to be completed by May 2009.

State small boat harbors are under the jurisdiction of the **Hawaii Department of Land and Natural Resources' Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation**.

The division operates and manages 19 harbors, 15 ramps, 2,122 moorings and berths across the state.
